TO ALL DIRECT DEALERS AND DEALERS:

Intake manifold screens for Diesel engines which take the place of the manifold gaskets are now available from the Parts Division.

These screens give added protection to the engines as they prevent the entrance of any sort of foreign material which might cause damage and necessitate expensive engine repairs.

In a Diesel engine, in order to obtain the necessary high compression, there is very little clearance between the piston and cylinder head and foreign material, which in a gasoline engine would pass out the exhaust, may wedge between the piston and head and cause damage.

It is suggested that whenever an intake manifold is removed for any reason that the screens be installed in the place of the gaskets. They can be obtained from the Parts Division at Marysville by ordering part number 871703 - six required per truck.

In order to further protect the engine, it is of extreme importance that the air-intake air cleaner be cleaned and re-oiled at frequent enough intervals to prevent any possibility of dust passing through it into the engine and causing premature wear. As a general rule, air cleaners should be serviced every 2000 miles, but especially dusty conditions may necessitate more frequent attention.
